Programs for All Interests and Ages

- *Tikvah Tots*, a monthly Sunday morning program of stories, crafts and songs, as well as other programs, for pre-schoolers.
- *Shtik Youth*, a United Synagogue Youth program for elementary, middle school and high school students.
- *An active PTA*, with opportunities for parental involvement and socializing.
- **Social Action** programs, including active participation in Scarsdale's United Interfaith Food Bank.
- Adult education classes include Torah study, prayers and other topics, as well as periodic Shabbat "Lunch and Learn" sessions.
